(To be filled up by an Ophthalmologist in Government Service)

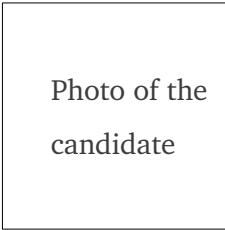
1. Is there any defect of vision?

2. Can the applicant readily distinguish the pigmentary colours red and green?
3. Does the applicant suffer from any night blindness?

Note: Details regarding standards of vision should be clearly stated in the Certificate as given above and vague statements such as vision normal, Good etc will not be accepted. Specification for each eye should be stated separately. Special attention should be directed to the distant vision. Required standard of vision are as follows.
