CHAPTER-I

CONSTITUTIONAL POSITION OF THE COMMISSION

The Public Service Commission is a body constituted under the provisions from Article 315 to 323 of the Constitution of India. The provisions regarding the Union Public Service Commission and other State Public Service Commissions have been laid down in Chapter II of part XIV of the Constitution.

The Constitution empowers the Commission to deal with the matters relating to the services and enable them to discharge their duties in a fair and impartial manner free from influence from any quarter. The Chairman and Members of the Kerala Public Service Commission are appointed by the Governor of the State. The composition of the Commission is such that as nearly as one half of members of it shall be persons who on the date of their appointment have at least 10 years of service under the Government. The Chairman or any other member of the Commission can hold office for a period of six years or till they attain the age of 62 years whichever is earlier. On the expiry of the term, the Chairman or any other Member of a State Public Service Commission shall be eligible for appointment as the Chairman or any other member of the Union Public Service Commission or as the Chairman of any other State Public Service Commission, but not for any other employment either under the Government of India or under the Government of a state. The Chairman or any other Member of the Commission can be removed from the office only by the President of India in accordance with the procedure laid down in the Constitution. The conditions of service of the Chairman or a Member once appointed cannot be varied to their disadvantage. The expenses connected with the Public Service Commission are not voted but are charged on the Consolidated Fund of State.

CHAPTER - II

COMPOSITION OF THE KERALA PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION

In accordance with the provisions contained under Regulation 3 of the Kerala Public Service Commission (Composition and Conditions of Service of Members and Staff) Regulations 1957, made by the Governor under Article 318 of the Constitution of India, as amended from time to time, the Commission shall consist of a Chairman and 20 Members.

CHAPTER – III FUNCTIONS OF THE COMMISSION

The functions of the Kerala Public Service Commission are as laid down in Article 320 of the Constitution of India with regard to the services of the State. They are:

- i) To conduct examinations for appointment to various services of the State.
- ii) To advise Government on:

a	Matters relating to method of recruitment to the various services of the State.
b	The principles to be followed in making appointments to the services of the State and in

	making promotion and transfers from one service to another and on the suitability of
	candidates for such appointments, promotions and transfers.
С	All disciplinary matters affecting government servants.
d	Claims of reimbursement of legal expenses incurred by the government servants in
	defending legal proceedings instituted against them for act done or purported to be done in
	the execution of their duty.
e	Claims for award of injury pension to government servants.
f	Any other matters referred to them by the government

The Commission also discharges the additional functions entrusted to them by the State Legislature under Article 321 of the constitution of India as regards the services and posts in Government owned Companies, Corporations, Boards and bodies constituted by law and of the Local Bodies in the State and certain Co-operative institutions. Later, additional functions of various Universities in Kerala were brought under the purview of the Commission.

The matters on which the Commission need not be consulted have been specified in the Kerala Public Service Commission (Consultation) Regulations, 1957 Part II, made under the proviso to Article 320(3) of the Constitution of India.

CHAPTER - IV

STAFF AND ACCOMMODATION

STAFF OF THE KERALA PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION

The total number of staff of the Commission during the year are 1814. The eight personnel working in Vigilance Cell are on deputation from the Department of Police and a Grade I Librarian from the Common Pool of Librarians. In exercise of the powers conferred on the Commission under Clause 12 – Sub Clause 2 of the Kerala Public Service Commission (Composition and Conditions of Service of Members and Staff) Regulation 1957, 25 posts in various categories were created for a period of 6 months in two spells with effect from 01.04.2020 and also from 01.10.2020. The details of Staff of the Commission during the period are given in **Appendix I.**

Due to the non-availability of Librarian Gr.I from common pool category from the Government, the Commission vide its Decision No.28 dated 26.11.2012 decided to appoint Librarian Gr.I on contract basis and appointed Sri.Syamkrishnan.R, as Librarian Gr.I with effect from the FN of 02.09.2013 vide Order No. Estt-II(2)-2129/2008/GW dated 02.09.2013 of the Secretary to the Commission. In addition to the above 29 Assistants and 5 Computer Assistant Grade II were appointed in the office of the Kerala Public Service Commission on supernumerary posts.

TEMPORARY STAFF APPOINTED

Under Regulation 12 (2) of the Kerala Public Service Commission (Composition and Conditions of Service of Members and Staff) Regulation 1957, the Commission have created

13 posts as per Order No. Estt-2-3/32900/2008-KPSC dated 13.05.2020 for a period of six months from 01.04.2020 and 12 posts for a period of six months with effect from 01.10.2020 as per order No. Estt-2-3/32900/2008-KPSC dated 14/09/2020.

VIGILANCE AND SECURITY OFFICER

ACCOMMODATION

The Kerala Public Service Commission have District Offices in all Districts and three Regional Offices at Kollam, Ernakulam and Kozhikode. The Head Office and the District office of the Commission are situated at Thulasi Hills, Pattom, Thiruvananthapuram. Altoghether there are 18 offices including the Head Office. The District Offices of Palakkad, Malappuram, Kozhikode and Kannur are accommodated in the respective Civil Stations. The Regional Office at Kozhikode is also functioning in the Civil Station. The District Offices in Alappuzha, Pathanamthitta, Thrissur, Wayanad and Kasargod are functioning in rented buildings. The District Office at Kottayam is functioning in Commission's own building. The Regional and District Offices at Ernakulam are functioning in GCDA building on rent. The District Office at Idukki is also functioning in a rented building of the Kerala State Housing Board at Kattappana. The District and Regional Offices at Kollam are housed in Corporation Building. The official residence of the Chairman at Thiruvananthapuram is also on rent.

GUEST HOUSE

Kerala Public Service Commission has a Guest House on rent located at Vrindavan Gardens, Pattom, Thiruvananthapuram owned by Kerala State Housing Board. It is being used to accommodate guests and experts invited by the Commission to assist in interviews, practical tests and evaluation of answerscripts.

CHAPTER - V

RESEARCH AND ANALYSIS WING, ONLINE EXAMINATION CENTRES, COMPUTERISED ATTENDANCE MANAGEMENT SYSTEM, AA&VW, WEBSITE, PUBLIC RELATIONS UNIT, ONE TIME REGISTRATION/ VERIFICATION, ENQUIRY, INFORMATION DISSEMINATION SECTIONS AND LIBRARY, RESEARCH AND ANALYSIS WING

The main function of Research & Analysis Wing is co-ordination, planning and monitoring of selection process with a view to improving the quality of work and minimising delay in the different stages of recruitment, by organising comprehensive studies and imparting in-service training to members of the staff. Purchase and maintenance of computers and other allied equipments are also done through the R&A wing.

Notifications received from various recruitment sections are consolidated and steps for publishing them in the Gazette are done in the section. Correspondence with other Public Service Commissions and Union Public Service Commission are done by Research & Analysis Wing. Agenda for the sittings of the Commission are also prepared in this wing.

Details regarding Legislative Assembly interpellation are collected and furnished to the Government through Research & Analysis Wing. During the period **69** questions were received from the Government and reply were given in all the cases. The compilation of the Annual Report of the Commission and furnishing of statistical data relating to different stages of selection are being prepared in the Wing.

The R&A is making use of IT enabled services to make the recruitment process faster, accurate and more transparent. It has also undertaken the revision of the PSC Manual in tune with the policy decisions of the commission.

The Technical committee constituted for the supervision of computerization in the office of the commission met on **09/09/2020**, **17/09/2020**, **22/09/2020** & **09/10/2020**. An amount of Rs. **8,37,00,000/-** (Rupees Eight Crores thirty seven lakhs only) was allotted during the financial year **2020-21** in the plan fund of which Rs. **300,00,000/-** (Rs. Three

crores only) was earmarked for computerisation and Rs.5,37,00,000/- (Rs. Five Crore Thirty Seven lakhs only) for Construction purposes. As the amount for construction is alloted to the plan head of PWD, only PWD can utilise this amount. A sum of Rs. 2,60,39,069/- (Rupees Two crores sixty lakhs thirty nine thousand and sixtynine only) has been spent for the up-gradation and modernization for the purchase of hardware, other computer peripherals, payment of AMC charges and various training programmes etc... The unutilised amount of Rs. 39,60,931/- (Rupees Thirty nine lakhs sixty thousand nine hundred and thirty one only) has been refunded.

TRAINING PROGRAMMES

Kerala Public Service Commission have organised various training programmes for staff to enhance their efficiency and to perform duties efficaciously. Due to the Covid 19 pandemic no training programme could be conducted during the period.

KERALA PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION – OFFICIAL FACEBOOK PAGE

The Kerala Public Service Commission has launched an official Facebook page giving updates, alerts and notifications regularly. This user friendly page is liked by more than 3 Lakhs youngsters.

ONE TIME REGISTRATION (OTR)

An online One Time Regisgtration has been introduced to facilitate the decision of the commission to publish the ranked lists within one year from the date of notification of inviting application. This was officially inaugurated by the then Chief Minister Sri Oommen Chandy on 28.03.2012. The section also provides One Time Verification of documents of candidates.

E-OFFICE SYSTEM IN KERALA PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION

E -Office is one of the Mission Mode Projects of Department of Information Technology of India functions under the National E-Governance Plan. E- Office aims to improve productivity, quality, resource management, turnaround time and increase transparency by replacing the old manual file process with an electronic file system. The entire system of movements has been migrated into E-Office.

ONLINE EXAMINATION CENTRES

Online Examination Centres of the commission are functioning at Thiruvananthapuram, Pathanamthitta, Eranakulam and Kozhikode with a capacity to hold 868 candidates at a time. A total of **1,736** candidates can be examined with single pattern of question on a day. A new Online examination centre at Palakkad which can hold 345 is nearing completion.

Expansion of Online Examinations in Engineering Colleges:

Besides our own online examination centres, we are conducting online examinations in forty government / aided engineering colleges from April 2018. Around 6000 online seats are available for conducting examinations.

COMPUTERIZED ATTENDANCE MANAGEMENT

Attendance Management Section has been established in Research and Analysis Wing to monitor the computerized attendance management under the supervision of the Establishment Section.

APPOINTMENT AUDIT AND VERIFICATION WING

As per the GO(P) 41/2010/P&ARD dated 14/12/2010 an appointment, audit and verification wing was started functioning w.e.f 01.09.2011. A total of **25,318** applications were received during the year and **19,779** cases have been verified during the year. Around **6,725** applications are pending for verification as on 31/03/2021. A total of **17,987** verification certificates have been issued from the section. The detials of service verification are furnished under **Appendix XL**.



PUBLIC RELATIONS UNIT- FUNCTIONS

The Public Relations Unit functions as an effective link between the Kerala Public Service Commission and the Public. The sustained effort of the Unit is instrumental in the maintenance of better rapport and good relations between the Commission and various Print and Visual media.

PERFORMANCE

Information intended for the Public is regularly being supplied by means of press releases and public statements. The dates of Examination and Interviews of the Commission are given due publicity through News Papers, All India Radio, Doordarshan, PSC Bulletin, other TV Channels and through Website of KPSC and Facebook .

Media organizations have extended wholehearted co-operation and rendered worthy assistance in giving due publicity. The opinions, suggestions, criticisms and complaints made by the public, and the views of press and public leaders are brought to the notice of the Commission by the Public Relations Unit. Whenever necessary, detailed public statements, clarifications etc... are being issued by the Commission through Public Relations Unit. The Public Relations Unit also functions as an information centre. During the year a total of 225 press releases were issued.

ENQUIRY WING

The Enquiry wing in the Head Office of the Commission works continuously from 8 am to 6 pm in two sessions on all working days. It consists of an Enquiry Officer and six Assistants. The Enquiry wing is rendering remarkable service to clarify the doubts of candidates approaching the Commission in person.

PUBLICATION OF PSC BULLETIN

The PSC Bulletin, the official publication of the Commission was relaunched on 01.06.1997. Ever since its relaunch the PSC Bulletin is being published regularly as fortnightly (24 issues in an year) on the 1st and 15th of every month.

Information oriented articles on contemporary issues and current affairs beneficial to job seeking youth are added with the regular columns such as clarification of doubts, Advice for Appointment, Ranked Lists, Short Lists, Interview Programme, Examination

Schedule, Previous Questions and Revised Answer Key of Various Tests conducted by the Commission. Articles relating to Science and Culture and model questions on general awareness, numerical aptitude, mental ability etc... are also published. The details of the Gazette Notifications inviting applications for selection to various posts are form the main features of the PSC Bulletin.

- 24 issues of PSC Bulletin have been published during the period and 15 new agents have been appointed to ensure the proper distribution of bulletin.
- During the year 15000 copies of special issue of "10000GK" has been reprinted and the same have been distributed all over kerala.

from the candidates. The cell is functioning under the control of a Joint Secretary who is the first appellate authority under the provisions of Right to Information Act . There are 18 State Public Information Officers and 19 Assistant Public Information Officers and one Appellate Authority designated in KPSC.

The Commission have decided to re-establish the centralised system under one SPIO in the rank of Under Secretary with two sections w.e.f 01.03.2014.

DETAILS OF DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS IN CONNECTION WITH RTI 2005

I. A departmental disciplinary action was recommended by State Information Commission in the judgement of Sri. Siju Kumar. B (AP No.2425(1)14/SIC), as there was a contradiction in the replies given to Sri.Siju Kumar B, Sri. Pratheesh Kumar. L and Jinesh Kumar.M. The queries were with regard to the opportunity granted for the submission of experience certificate in connection with the selection to the post of Painter in KSRTC. The disciplinary action is pending.

DETAILS OF DISCIPLINARY ACTION RECOMMENDED BY STATE INFORMATION COMMISSION, KERALA

II. In a second appeal filed by Sri. Arunkumar R V involving request for copies of OMR answer script in respect of test held on 13.11.2010 for the post of Typist in government. Secretariat (Category No.349/08), the SIC on 09.11.2016 ordered to supply the record called

for by the appellant, free of cost. Since it was informed from the section concerned that the OMR sheet of the appellant was not available, the SPIO informed SIC that the order dated 09.11.2016 could not be implemented for want of original OMR scripts. But the Commission did not accept this argument and recommended to submit a report before higher officials concerned for supply of OMR answer sheet. Accordingly a report in the matter has been furnished to Secretary PSC and the same was forwarded to SS1 Section, KPSC for initiating disciplinary action.







GRAPHICAL RERPRESENTATION - COMMUNICATIONS SENT






CHAPTER –VII EXAMINATIONS

During the year 164 written /OMR Test were conducted for various posts in which 31,72,353 candidates were admitted. In addition, 29 Online Examinations were also conducted where 2744 candidates were admitted.



RESERVATION GROUPS ADVISED ON OC AND BC TURNS GRAPHICAL REPRESENTATION



CHAPTER-IX

RECRUITMENT - COMPANIES / CORPORATIONS / BOARDS / LOCAL AUTHORITIES/UNIVERSITIES

Under Article 321, An Act made by the Legislature of a State may provide for the exercise of additional functions by the State Public Service Commission as respects the services of the State and also as respects the services of any local authority or other body corporate constituted by law or of any public institution. The State Legislature enacted various legislations in respect of Companies, Corporations, Boards, Local Authorities and Universities as additional functions to the Kerala Public Service Commission. Selection process to various posts to these institutions are carried on in Corporation Wing which functions under an Additional Secretary. At present there are **110** Companies, Corporations, Boards and **3** Local Authorities, **4** Welfare Boards and **13** Universities for which recruitment of candidates are made through Kerala Public Service Commission.

During the year **97** posts were notified for selection to various posts in Companies, Corporations, Boards and Local Authorities for which **20,16,649** applications were received.**3,259** candidates were advised to these bodies.

CHAPTER - X

RECRUITMENT – CO-OPERATIVE SECTOR

The Kerala Public Service Commission (Additional Functions in Respect of Certain Societies) Act 1996 empowering the Commission to exercise additional functions in regard to the recruitment of employees in 15 Apex Co-operative Societies and District Co-operative Banks. The rules under the Act viz, The Kerala Public Service Commission (Consultation by Committee of Co-operative Society) Rules, 1998 were issued on 10.03.1998. Selection process to various posts to these bodies are carried out in Co-operative Sector Section, which functions under a Joint Secretary. Selection process for 14 District Co-operative Banks, 15 Apex Co-operative Societies and 3 other societies are under the purview of the Commission. At present 28 Co-Operative institutions are under the purview of the Commission.

During the year **57** posts were notified for selection to various posts in Co-operative sector for which **8,34,605** applications were received and **386** candidates were advised by the commission.

CHAPTER - XI



GRAPHICAL REPRESENTATION













CHAPTER – XV RECRUITMENT - GENERAL INFORMATION

PAUCITY OF QUALIFIED CANDIDATES

There were **63** cases of paucity of qualified candidates under General Recruitment. The details of such posts are given in **APPENDIX-XVI**.

CHAPTER – XVI RECRUITMENT -KERALA ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICE

Notification inviting applications for Kerala Administrative Service, held for the first time in its history by the Kerala Public Service Commission was issued on 1 November, 2019, the day on which State of Kerala was formed. Date of the examination and the syllabus for it were published along with the notification. The selection procedure was stipulated in three phases,viz; screening test, descriptive examination and interview. Selection to this service, with an undergraduate degree as its basic eligibility, was conducted in three streams. Stream 1: Direct appointment. Stream 2: Recruitment from personnel already in service. Stream 3: From among employees belonging to Common category such as Gazetted Officers, Administrative Officers and Administrative Assistants in identified departments. Total number of applicants were 5,76,243. Preliminary examination was conducted on 22 February, 2020. Its result was declared on 23 October ,2020. Examinations in the descriptive mode were conducted on 20 and 21 November, 2020. Short lists for all the three strams were published on 24 March, 2021. Subsequent steps were conducted after giving opportunity to get copies of the OMR sheet to the candidates who had submitted requisite application on publication of the Short List. This was a departure from the current procedure of PSC to ensure credibility and transparency. Interviews for the time-bound completion of the selection process to this service are nearing completion.

CHAPTER – XVII DEPARTMENTAL TESTS

CONDUCT OF DEPARTMENTAL TESTS

Departmental Tests of July 2020 was conducted from 10.10.2020 to 07.12.2020 and Departmental Tests of January 2021 from 16.04.2021. From January 2019 onwards all departmental examinations are **Online Objective** except the second language tests in Malayalam, Tamil, Kannada and minority Language test in Kannada and Tamil. The details of various tests conducted, details of candidates admitted and a list of centres selected for the same during the period from 01.04.2020 to 31.03.2021 are shown in the separate lists

attached in **APPENDIX – XXVIA**.

The list of various special tests is shown in the list attached in **APPENDIX-XXVIB**.

PUBLICATION OF RESULTS

The Result of the Departmental Tests January 2020 was published on 29-05-2020 and that of July 2020 was published on 01-03-2021. The details showing the results of the various Departmental Tests are furnished in **APPENDIX XXVII A**. Details regarding the result of the special tests are furnished in **APPENDIX-XXVII B**. There were **139** tests (including **8** Special tests and 21 eligibility tests) and 10 viva voce test for blind candidates. These tests were conducted in **52** centres and **98** OMR centres throughout the state. The details are shown in **APPENDIX XXVII C**. Departmental and Adhoc Tests including Departmental Examinations for Junior Members of the IAS, IPS & IFS were also held during the year. The particulars regarding the publication of results are given in **APPENDIX XXVII B**.

CASES OF RECHECKING

A total of 85 applications were received during the year for rechecking the answer scripts of which 17 applications were rejected.

Thirteen applications were received during the year for the photocopy of answer scripts and one application was rejected and 12 photocopies of answer scripts were issued.



One of the important functions of the Commission under Article 320(3)(c) is to advise Government on all disciplinary matters affecting Government Services.

Number of disciplinary cases pending with the Commission at the beginning of the year was **55.** A total of **142** cases were received from the Government during the year. The Commission rendered advice on **152** cases. The number of cases pending with the Commission at the close of the year were **45.** The number of cases pending with the Government were **314.**

CHAPTER – XXV COMMITTEE FOR REDRESSAL OF COMPLAINTS OF

(Internal Complaints Committee)

WOMEN EMPLOYEES

Based on the Supreme Court judgement dated 13.08.1997, the Government directed PSC to set up an internal complaint redressal mechanism and to constitute a Committee for the time bound redressal of complaints of women employees in accordance with the guidelines laid down by the Supreme Court. Accordingly the Commission constituted a Committee with effect from 25.04.2001 and the same is functioning effectively in tune with the guidelines of the Apex Court.

Internal Complaints Committee had been reconstituted in the office of the Kerala Public Service Commission with effect from 20.07.2013 as envisaged in the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 with

senior most woman officer of KPSC as the Presiding Officer, two employees and an NGO activist as members, keeping in line with the norms stipulated in the Act.

As the commission is considered as a single entity and provincial in nature, no separate committes have been formed in the Regional and District Offices. The petitions from Regional and District Offices of the Commission are handed over to the Presiding Officer, who in turn takes action in accordance with the procedure laid down in the Act. The Committee hold sittings at the regional/district concerned to collect evidences and statements in such complaints. The Committee met on 22.10.2020. There is no complaint received during the said period.

CHAPTER – XXVI

DEVIATION FROM THE ADVICE OF THE KERALA PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION

1) A1 -1/19/2020/KPSC

Government had sought advice of the commission regarding the tentative decision taken against Sri. X, Veterinary Surgeon of Animal Husbandry Department barring his two annual increment with cumulative effect as per Rule II (1) (VA) of KCS (CC&A) and refix his liability to the sum of Rs. 1,40,886 as the part of the disciplinary action taken against him. The Hon'ble Commission examined the case in detail with relevent documents and advised the Government, that the punishment imposed by the Government to him was not proportionate to such a serious crime and could be given a severe punishment including

removing from the service. As it is stipulated by the rule that the disciplinary authority could decide the punishment to be given to the employee and after considering the advice of the Commission given as per the rule 15 (12) (II) of KCS (CC&A) and also the petition submitted by the employee, the Government by overruling the advice of the Commission, issued a Govt. order No GO(O) 248/2020/AHD dtd. 18.08.2020 thereby settling the tentative decision previously taken by the Government.

2) A1-2/61/2019/KPSC

Mr. Rajesh, native of Neyyattinkara escaped from the Police station on 24.10.2013 when he has taken in to police custody at Kattakada Police Station on the suspicion of attempting to steal from a bakery while Mr. X was working as police constable in the Kattakkada Police Station. An enquiry was ordered after suspending Mr. X from the service as it was Prima facie aware that he had tainted the reputation of police force by acting irresponsibly. After the enquiry, the investigating officer came to the conclusion that the accused was guilty. Rural District police Head, Thiruvananthapuram settled the case by issuing an order by barring two annual increment with cummulative effect and treating the period of the suspension as leave (Non – duty).

The Range IG, by considering the review petition submitted by the petitioner against the above order, the punishment of barring to annual increment with cumulative effect was reduced to one annual increment with cumulative effect and issued an order to this effect. Against this order Sri. X had submitted a review petition to Government and considering the review petition, the Government took a tentative decision to reduce his punishment as censure and sought the advice of the Commission. As KPSC had disagreed with the tentative decision, the Government had rejected the review petition and also rejected the mercy petition submitted by the petitioner.

Even though no case had been registered against Rajesh, who had escaped from the Police Station, Sri. X had to be more vigilant in this regard. Moreover the punishment of barring annual increment with cumulative effect given at the departmental level for the above offense was disproportionate. So the Government took a tentative decision to reduce the punishment as censure and sought advice of the commission with letter number

3274324/H5/2019/Home dtd. 09.10.2019.

The commission examined the case in detail with relevant documents. The punishment given to Sri. X was based on an incident in which a suspect in a theft case had escaped from the police station. The incident took place when only the accused and another woman police officer were present. KPSC did not agree with the tentative decision earlier taken by the Government to reduce the punishment of barring annual increment with cummulative effect to censure. The review petition and mercy petition were dismissed and the rule doesn't allow to file a review petition again. As per the rule 36(c) of KPDIP & A Rules, stating that "There shall be only one review and the application for review shall be made within a period of two months from the date of orders sought to be reviewed". Therefore the commission advised the Government that it was not possible to file a review petition under the rule through the letter No. A1-2/61/2019/KPSC dtd. 28.01.2020. But overruling the advice of the Commission the Government issued an Order (MR)132/2020/Home dtd. 22.02.2020 and thereby lowered the disciplinary action against him as censure.

3) A1 -2/78/2020/KPSC

Mr. X, the Panchayath Secretary of Kodumbu Grama Panchayath of Palakkad District had been retired from the service while he was facing a disciplinary action for failing to renew legal license to a fertilizer - insecticide - Cement retail shop of Sri. K. Narayanan. As he retired, the disciplinary action taken against him by the Panchayath Director had settled and recommended the Government to take further action as per rule 3 Part III of KSR. Government examined the case and took a tentative decision to recover Rs. 200/- per month for an year from his pension amount and a showcause notice was given to him for the same.

On the basis of the order issued by the Kerala Administrative Tribunal on the OA No. 2365/2019 filed by the Sri. X against the disciplinary action taken against him on the basis of the opinion of the Law Department not to file appeal against this order and also as the time limit allowed by the court to execute the order had exceeded, Government issued an order (GO (Rt) No. 1873/2020/LSGD Dtd. 12.10.2020) insisting the panchayath Director to recover Rs. 2400/- from his DCRG as per the amount stated in the showcause notice given to him earlier and also the Government sought advice of the Commission regarding the

settlement of disciplinary action taken against him after eliminating the remaining levels of the disciplinary action.

The Commission viewed that the unilateral decision of the Government to impose punishment to the officer concerned for the abuse of power and acts that challenged the rule of law was an encroachment on the constitutional responsibility and powers of the Commission. The Government had enough time to take action against him who had retired from the service in 2017. The Commission had informed the Government of their dissatisfaction with the decision to finalise the disciplinary action without seeking the advice of the Commission.

4) A1-3/3/2019-KPSC

The Commission tendered their advice on 10/03/2017 through letter No A1(3) 4411/16/GW to the advice sought by the government in the letter No. 53778/D3/13/RD dated 20/05/2016 regarding the tentative decision taken by the Government after considering the statement of defence of accused and after hearing them. Government decided to give provisional pension to Sri.X, former Thodupuzha Thahasildar and Sri.Y, former Idukki Additional Village Officer untill the final judgement of High Court on the order filed by them against the order of Vigilance Court (CC 167/2016).

Government reconsidered the case on the basis of advice rendered by the Commission and decided to settle the tentative decision taken in the Showcause notice to reduce 50% of their pension amount and sought advise of the Commission in this regard with letter no P119/D3/2017/GW dtd: 22/12/2017. The Hon'ble Commission rendered their advice on 12/06/2018 with letter no: A1(3)4411/16/GW. As per KSR part 3 rule 3, the part of the pension withholding should not exceed 1/3 of pension initially sanctioned. In this case government had suffered financial loss and it had been proved in the court also. So the commission held that it is proper to take decesion as per KSR part 3 rule (2) (A) & (B) and advice accordingly.

The Government again examined the case in detail in the light of the advice rendered by the Commission. It is mentioned in the rule 2(A) of KSR part 3 as 'future good conduct shall be an implied condition of every grant of a pension. The Government may by order in writing withhold or withdraw apension or part thereof weather permanently or for a specific period, if the pensioner is convicted of a serious crime or is found guilty of grave misconduct and in (b) as where a pensioner is convicted of a serious crime by a court of law, action under class shall be taken in the light of the judgement of the court relating to such conviction'. Rule 2(a) States that it is a disciplinary action against a service pensioner who is involved in or engagged in any kind of a crime and that 2(b) refers to the action taken by the court to punish such pensioner who had participated in such an offence. Sri.X, former Thodupuzha Thahaseeldar and Sri.Y, former Idukki Additional Village Officer who were convicted by the court after retiring from the service for the crimes committed while they were in the service and it therefore appears that action cannot be taken under rule (2) part (3) of KSR on the ground that they had been suspended as part of disciplinary action while continuing in service and a person had retired while he was in suspension. As it was found to be in accordance with the law, the Government had requested the Commission to be persuaded on the matter submitted for advice of the Commission. In this case it is clear that the accused committed the offence while they were in service and rule (2) part (3) of KSR applies to them because they committed the offence while they were in service and caused financial loss to the Government. Vigilance Court also recommended action under rule (2) part (3) of KSR. Rule (3) part (3) of KSR applies to offences committed by pensioners. So the commission disagreed with the tentative decision taken by the Government to reduce 50% pension and rendered advice in this regard on 12/06/2018 and 24/05/2019 respectively. As the Commission had disagreed with the tentative decision both times, the Government by overuling the advice of the Commission by reducing 50% of pension amount in every month and issued an order with No GO (Rt) No 2236/2020/RD dated: 16/06/2020.

CHAPTER – XXVII COMPARATIVE SUMMARY OF WORK DONE BY KERALA PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION

Since the manpower was found insufficient to cope up with the enormously increasing workload the Commission resorted to modern mechanization and technologies with effect from 2002, so as to achieve simplification, accuracy and speed in the selection process. A tabular form of comparative study of work done for the last ten reporting years (2011-2012 to 2020-2021 and five years comparison of work done (2011-2012 to 2015-2016 & 2016-2017 to 2020-2021) are shown in the following pages.




